Rules:

In Addition to General and Health Rules:

1. Enter by July 15 using online Show Works. No day of entries will be accepted.
2. ARBA rules are applied based on the Standards of Perfection for Rabbits and Cavies.
3. Check-in is from 7:00 to 8:00am on the day of the show. All rabbits must be checked in before the start of the show.
4. All rabbits must be the property of the exhibitor at least 30 days prior to the show.
5. All rabbits must be disease free, showing no health issues (sore hocks, ear mites, snotty nose). If a rabbit is disqualified (DQ) by the judge, the rabbit must go home.
6. All rabbits must have a permanent, legible tattoo in the left ear. Tattooing will be available during check in at a cost of \$3.00 per rabbit.
7. Dual Entry: Rabbits entered in the single Fryer Competition cannot be entered as part of a meat pen trio or in a breed class.
8. Rabbits will receive cage assignment when they are finished showing per availability.
9. Absolutely NO individual is allowed beyond any sign stating "AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY" unless authorized by barn superintendent. This pertains to check in, during show, throughout the duration of the fair, and at release time Sunday.
10. All rabbits with an assigned a cage must stay for duration of the fair to receive premiums unless excused by superintendents.
11. The superintendents will be responsible for feeding, watering, and reasonable precautions for the safety and welfare of the rabbits.
12. All rabbits will be released Sunday following the fair from 8:00am – 12:00pm.
13. Exhibitors must sign "Thank You" cards before release of their rabbits.
14. ALL youth selling rabbits at the Junior Livestock Premium Auction must acknowledge their buyer with a thank you sign hung over cage.
15. Final decisions, relative to Rabbit Department will be made by the Rabbit Department Superintendents.

Section C - Market Rabbits Class

1. Meat pens consist of three rabbits all of the same breed and variety, but do not have to be from the same litter. Age limit, not over 10 weeks. Weight from 3 ½ lbs. (3.08 lbs.) to 5½ lbs. (5.08 lbs.)
2. Single Fryers are any meat breed not over 10 weeks of age weighing 3 ½ lbs. (3.08 lbs.) to 5½ lbs. (5.08 lbs.)
3. Doe and Litter – Judged on number of kits, uniformity of kits, and condition of doe.
